

Pupil Premium Statement

The Pupil Premium is an allocation of additional funding provided to schools to support specific groups of children who are vulnerable to possible to underachievement. These include pupils who have or have had an entitlement to Free School Meals (FSM), those 'looked after' by the Local Authority and the children of armed service personnel.

The School works to spend the Pupil Premium (which is additional to the main school funding) in ways which help to advance their academic progress and improve their life opportunities.

This current financial year 2015/2016, pupil premium funding amounts to £17,740.00 for 15 pupils.

The 2015/2016 Pupil Premium funding is intended to be allocation in following ways:

- Small group work with a teacher focused on overcoming gaps in learning
- Subsidising of residential visits and other educational visits
- Subsidising breakfast clubs, extra-curricular clubs and school uniform
- Release for ELSA provision
- Additional ELSA provision for pupils
- Purchasing IT resources and software to assist children's learning
- Purchasing resources to support children's learning
- Pupil premium monitoring and tracking to narrow the achievement gap

The Pupil Premium is being used to:

- accelerate individual's pupil progress with aims to 'narrow the achievement gap'
- involve pupils in wider educational opportunities
- promote pupil well-being
- enhance professional development of key staff
- provide technological assistance & resources to support learning
- Prioritise pupil premium expenditure
- Manage pupil premium provision

This current academic year 2014/15, pupil premium funding amounts to £18,610 for 13 pupils.

The 2014/15 Pupil Premium funding is intended to be allocation in following ways:

- Small group work with a teacher focused on overcoming gaps in learning
- Subsidising of residential visits and other educational visits
- Subsidising breakfast clubs and extra-curricular clubs
- ELSA (Emotional Literacy) training for one staff member
- Additional ELSA provision for pupils
- Purchasing IT resources and software to assist children's learning
- Purchasing Literacy resources to support children's writing skills

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- accelerate individual's pupil progress with aims to 'narrow the achievement gap'
- involve pupils in wider educational opportunities
- promote pupil well-being
- enhance professional development of key staff
- provide technological assistance & resources to support learning

Impact of Pupil Premium 2014/2015:

- Residential visits and other educational visits were able to be accessed by 4 pupils.
- One staff member completed ELSA qualification.
- Breakfast club able to be accessed regularly by 2 pupils.
- Extra-curricular fee paying clubs accessed by 1 pupil.
- Learning accessed across the school via 10 ipad mini.
- Individual pupil learning needs accessed via 2 ipad air.
- Supportive Learning resource for writing accessed in K.S.2.
- ELSA support accessed by 4 pupils.
- P.E kit provision provided for 1 pupil to access full P.E curriculum.
- Year 6 SATs booster sessions accessed by 5 pupils.

School Data:

Early Years Foundation Stage:

- 91% of Early Years Foundation Stage pupils achieved a good level of development (GLD) (National GLD 72%).
- 100% (1 out of 1) pupils attracting pupil premium achieved EYFS expectations.

SATs Attainment at the end of K.S.1:

There were no pupils in Yr2 attracting pupil premium this year.

- 91% of pupils attained 2b+ in Maths (National Average 82%)
- 91% of pupils attained 2b+ in Reading (National Average 82%)
- 64 % of pupils attained 2b+ in Writing (National Average 72%)

- L3 achieved for 55% of KS1 pupils in Reading (National Average 32%)
- L3 achieved for 45% of KS1 pupils in Maths (National Average 26%)
- L3 achieved for 9% of KS1 pupils in Writing (National Average 18%)

Progress at Lower K.S.2:

- 33% (1 out of 3) pupils attracting pupil premium made 2 sub levels progress or more in Maths
- 66% (2 out of 3) pupils attracting pupil premium made 2 sub levels progress or more in Reading
- 66% (2 out of 3) pupils attracting pupil premium made 2 sub levels progress or more in Writing

Progress at Upper K.S.2:

- 89% (8 out of 9) pupils attracting pupil premium made 2 sub levels or more progress in Maths
- 67% (6 out of 9) pupils attracting pupil premium made 2 sub levels or more progress in Reading
- 89% (8 out of 9) pupils attracting pupil premium made 2 sub levels or more progress in Writing

SATs Attainment at the end of KS2:

60% (3 out of 5) pupils attracting pupil premium achieved level 4+ in Reading
100% (5 out of 5) pupils attracting pupil premium achieved level 4 in Writing
60% (3 out of 5) pupils attracting pupil premium achieved level 4 in Maths

40% (2 out of 5) pupils attracting pupil premium achieved level 5 in Reading
0% (0 out of 5) pupils attracting pupil premium achieved level 5 in Writing
0% (0 out of 5) pupils attracting pupil premium achieved level 5 in Maths
