Future Plans- Outside Areas

We have recently applied for funding to start the work on our outside area plans.

- Phase 1- to develop the learning garden- replace the ropes and sections of the walkway, tidy the ponds and cutback the over-grown areas.
- Phase 2- Rotovate the meadow and clear some of the more "weedish" plants and sow wildflower seeds
- Phase 3- Clear sections of the wooded area, and create pathways into the small glades
- Phase 4- Develop a quiet, reflective area, water feature and book shed
- Phase 5- Make a permanent structure at the top of the meadow as an outdoor classroom.

We are very excited about how these plans will enhance our outdoor learning environment, which is already being enjoyed by the children who do the Forest Schools. We're Going on a Bear Hunt!

Last week the children in Beech class started learning and exploring the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' by Michael Rosen. They enjoyed acting out the story and created their own story maps. Working together as a team, the whole class made a story tray using materials, drawings and junk models before retell the story with small figures to retell.

Next we focused on the long grass and the children made collage pictures using scissors to cut different types of threads and ribbons and wavy strips of card and paper. With the help of Chestnut class, the children constructed bridges to cross the river in our outside learning area. They worked well together moving the heavy tyres and planks before trying out their structures.

This week, the children looked carefully at snowflakes from a snowstorm, before drawing and painting their own.

During our Outdoor learning session, the children investigated the feel of mud and used excellent words to describe the texture before making their own hand print pictures. They also explored the 'forest' in our school playground before creating leaf rubbings. We will continue to explore the story next week... and may even find the bear!















Chestnut Class

In Maths, we have broadened our learning to include money and had a wonderful time playing shops and shopkeepers in our outside area. This deepened our understanding of coins and how to use them in transactions and our understanding of coin value. The Year 1s have also been working hard to subtract and add within 20, several of whom have completed their Green Maths Challenge books and passed their tests already. The Year 2's have been subtracting and adding within 100, solidified their understanding of tens and ones, and how to subtract and add crossing 10. Everyone has been working so hard and it has been lovely to watch.

In English, we have spent the last few weeks looking at the Three Little Pigs. The children have loved acting this out and have extended this into their own playtime. We have been writing sentences as captions for images, sequencing events, studying words and new vocabulary and retelling the story.

Chestnut class are still flourishing in school and whether they are being mathematicians, writers, investigators, scientists, historians, musicians, or all of the above, they are working exceptionally hard.

















Willow Class



Willow are now in full swing and working so well with the new objectives in Year 3 and 4. We are using new methods and skills to help our learning which were challenging at first but the children have shown resilience and are now showing progress in their independent work.

In English we have begun our new topic of Poetry which has been inspired by the beautiful poetry book "It Starts with a Seed". They began the topic by going on a nature walk to brainstorm ideas and see if they could think of any rhyming nature words. They are now just finishing their fact files of a sycamore leaf and seed which will be made into an Anthology. Once completed they will be designing their own poem about nature.

In Maths we are now in the last two weeks where we will look closely at Multiplication and Division. They are using new methods to help them nail those timetables and also be able to multiply/divide larger numbers. In Science we are showing how forces work in real life. In particular children learnt about air resistance through the making of parachutes where the class were able to see what happened to their creations when dropped from a certain height.


For your information, each morning we have a routine where it will be either quiet reading or carrying on with their maths challenge books. Please see the schedule below

Oak class have become myth writers in English over the last two weeks. Using our knowledge of Greek myths and mythical creatures, we discussed and explored key themes within Greek myths. We also worked in small groups to become more familiar with particular Greek myths and retell these to our peers. This week, we have been working on planning our own Greek myth. On Monday we used the story mountain format to develop the plot for our myth and on Wednesday, we explored personality traits of a hero to create a role on the wall for our protagonist. We are really looking forward to writing our myth next week.

In our Maths lessons, we have been using our times tables to help solve problems involving factors and multiples. We have used this knowledge to find highest common factors and lowest common multiples. We then consolidated our understanding of a formal written method for multiplication, using the column method to multiply 2 digit numbers by 2 digit numbers and beyond!

We have continued to explore the power of God in RE and this week began to evaluate what Christians believe about God's power. We used our understanding from previous lessons to develop questions we would ask God about his power. The children thought very carefully about this and asked some very insightful questions.

The highlight of the last two weeks for Oak class has to be on the trip to Roche Court, which was very kindly paid for by Chris Hammond. We spent the day with our tour guide Holly, who talked to us about some of the different sculptures on display around the site. For different sculptures, we also completed activities linked to their key themes or ideas. In the afternoon, we had our own sculpture workshop, where we used foil and electrical tape to make animal sculptures in the style of 'Left Handed Drummer' by Barry Flanagan. We had a fantastic time and really learned a lot. A big thank you to Paul Stewart and Andrew Harper for accompanying us on the trip.
