## Cluster Sports Successes

On Monday we took teams to compete in the Cluster Sports competition. The children had to take part in a number of field events and finish with track events. All schools could nominate children, from each year group, to represent their schools.

The KS1 Team were very successful and came in first place, achieving gold medals. They were able to demonstrate strong performances across all the disciplines which resulted in their overall win. This is now the third placing that our KS1 children have achieved in Cluster events, showing that the size of the school does not mean that there can't be high levels of success in competition. It is great to see this development, which supports the rationale for the additional sports provision in school and clubs.

The KS2 Team put in a very strong performance in the field events and were topping the leader board. The track events showed that there were some exceptional runners in each of the year groups from cluster schools which resulted in our overall position of fourth. The children have expressed that whilst they enjoyed the event, there was some disappointment in their overall placing. This is an important part of the learning journey of competition, winning well and learning from disappointment. We look forward to our next tournament rounders at Test Valley.

## Thought for the Week

This week we have been thinking about "taking part" and joining in. Sometimes this needs persistence - being a 'Have a go Hero'. We heard about Maximus Mouse and all the work he does. This week he became jealous when he thought that someone else was getting all of the attention. We prayed: Heavenly Father, there are times when we get very jealous over the success of others. Help us to understand that we must do what we are able to do and not complain about what we cannot do. Amen

It is wonderful to have everybody back after a beautiful half term. The sun has been shining and we have done our first harvest of broad beans and strawberries this week. Beech Class had a visitor from the Romsey District Beekeeping Society who taught the children all about bees. They were fascinated by the extracts of honeycomb, wasp nests and honey that they were allowed to hold and touch. There were also real bees, wasps and hornets in glass that the children were able to see up close.

Our new topic for this half term is 'Beside the Seaside' and the children have been exploring sea creatures and their habitats. With the beautiful weather, the class have been cooling off with their feet in rock pools, keeping a close eye out for jellyfish! The sandpit has also been a firm favourite and the children have enjoyed making sandcastles, sculptures and bug hotels.

Our literacy focus book for the next two weeks is 'Leo and the Octopus', a story about Leo who feels that the world is too loud and bright, which makes him think that he is from the wrong planet. This book is a brilliant one for building empathy as it raises awareness of what life is like living with autism. The children have used this book to support them in asking and answering questions about octopuses. The Reception children have been practising questions verbally as well as drawing question marks in chalk pen on a tuff tray. The year 1 girls have been writing their own questions, using question words and question marks. The girls then used laptops to research the answers to their questions online.

In Mathematics, the children have been reading, counting and writing numbers up to 100, partitioning them into 10 s and 1 s . The class daily count now goes all the way up to 100 and the children have been shooting two -digit numbers with water pistols outside, writing them down on whiteboards and comparing them with their opponents. We have also taken our learning outside and used the drawings and numbers on the top playground to find the numeral that is one more or one less than a given number.


## Willow Class

We have started a new unit in English, looking at a wordless book, 'Journey' by Aaron Becker. The children have explored the images within the book, looking at the story and the feelings of the main character.

In Maths last week, we looked at measuring capacity. The children started the week with reading scales before moving on to measurement. They were tasked with creating a potion (they could choose what it was for) and had to measure out accurately different amounts before adding them together. This week in fractions, the children have been finding unit and non-unit fractions. The children have secured their understanding of bar models and should be able to explain to you how to use them in find fractions.

In Art this half term, we will be looking at money containers before designing our own and making it. Over the past couple of weeks, the children have explored existing money containers, looking at similarities and differences and then looking at different stitches.

We have continued to look at plants and are now focusing on flowering plants. In the first session, the children were able to name and label an image of a flowering plant and use that information in the second session to pull a flower apart and identify its different parts.


## Oak Class

It has been a hot couple of weeks, but we have not let this weather stop our learning!

In English, we have started exploring a new text 'The Queen's Tale', which is the story of Snow White but from the Queen's perspective. We familiarised ourselves with the text and character of the Queen by thinking about adjectives that best describe her. We also looked carefully at artist's interpretations of the Queen from Snow White to explore similes and metaphors to help describe her. This helped us write some fantastic character descriptions for 'wanted' posters. This week, we have been focusing on using dialogue to develop the action in a story. We gathered different synonyms for 'said' and then revised our use of inverted commas. We began to think about the story from the huntsman's perspective and wrote diary entries in character to develop our empathy towards him.

In Maths, we have been consolidating our understanding of fractions. We started by comparing and ordering fractions, with the Year 5 and 6 children using fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers, before moving on to adding and subtracting fractions in word problems. This week, we have used different representations to explore the equivalence between fractions, decimals and percentages and have begun to find fractions of amounts and a percentage of an amount.

Our Science topic this term is 'Circulation and the Circulatory system' so we started with looking at what our blood is made up of. Miss Lee used different every day materials (red water beads for red blood cells and marshmallows for white blood cells!) to show us the four components of blood and explained to us what each did. We then drew our own scientific drawings with labels to represent this.

We have been excited about our DT, where we received a letter from the Parish council asking us to explore the accessibility of the village park. We began this journey by researching different play equipment and evaluating whether it was inclusive or accessible. We then conducted some market research and asked the children in the school for their views on the play equipment on offer. This helped us design our own playground with equipment, which we will be making models of in the coming weeks.

On top of all that exciting learning, we have also had fantastic swimming lessons and have been extremely busy practicing for our school play!
