News from around school

Beech


The children are coming to the end of their learning journey for Superworm and have been preparing to write letters to him to help them with a variety of things, from learning spellings to tidying their room. We have also been learning about when to use a capital letter and have learned about syllables to aid our reading.

In Maths, the year 1 children have been partitioning 10 to create number bonds, which they have then used to solve one-step word problems. I was incredibly impressed with the children's resilience while completing the problem solving exercises as they found their own resources to support them.

The Reception children have been mixing potions and using language linked to capacity, pouring coloured liquid from one container to another to see which holds the most.

To continue our theme of nature for this half term, the children created a word mat for each of the four seasons, commenting on the weather, plants, and animals that we may see throughout. We also went pond dipping in the learning garden to see if we could find any signs of spring in the water!







Chestnut

This week, Chestnut class have moved on to looking at statistics in Maths. They looked at tally charts and block diagrams, before moving on to collect their own information using a tally chart and presenting it in a block diagram. Some of topics were: favourite chocolate bars, favourite ice cream flavours, and favourite video games.

English started this week with the children performing our poem, Another Sensational Day. They were able to do this by heart and added actions to help them remember the lines. On Tuesday, in English, the children explored the school grounds by using their five senses. Later on in the week, the children were identifying different word classes. They began with having to sort out a pile of words into four different categories – nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs. They then used these different cards to create different sentences. One of Elijah's was: 'Thin ladies sloppily crept to the house'. Emelia had: 'Hungrily, the fat bird jumped into the hotel.'

In Geography this week, we moved on from looking at the United Kingdom and zoomed in on Romsey, the focus

for our topic. The children explored the surrounding areas of Romsey using Google maps. They were given places to identify and then asked to describe the location of some of them in relation to Romsey, e.g. Andover is north of Romsey, while Eastleigh is east.







Willow

This week in Willow class we have hired a lighthouse keeper! We have been building, learning and writing about lighthouses so far this term, and after posting a job advert at the end of last week, we have hired someone this week. Now the children have been working hard to create a set of instructions/ explanation for the lighthouse keeper's jobs. Some of them are starting to looks really good!

In Maths, we have been focusing on times-tables and the children have been working together to practise their times tables using resources, drawing, writing and verbally. The children had a lot of control and were told they have to practise different tables. Once shown a few different ways to practise, they then set themselves off. They worked very hard and focused really well.



Whilst we have been learning about West Tytherley, we have been doing lots of map work and learning how to use a map and a compass together. We have also been planning walks, one around the local area, and one in a nearby city - Southampton. We want to find out what the differences are between rural and urban areas, and what features we will find on our walks next week. Stay tuned to find out.











Oak

On Monday, Oak class took part in Mars Day 2022, organised by ESERO-UK – the UK space education office. The day was spent taking part in interactive webinars and learning from engineers and scientists about current explorations of the Red Planet. In particular, we were fascinated to find out about different kinds of Mars Rovers, as we are designing and building our own in the classroom. There was a question and answer session and we were delighted when Marley's question was read out and answered. We are surprised that you didn't hear our excited squealing and cheering! He asked

"How do astronauts get out of their spacesuits?" We were told it take two hours and a buddy to get into it, and half an hour to get out of it!

We have designed a Mars Rover and learned how to measure (more than twice) and cut wood for a chassis, before building the rest of the components onto the Rover.
