## **News from around school**


#### **Beech**

After our exciting trip to the park, Beech class looked at other parks from around the world and thought of how they could improve West Tytherley Playing Fields. There were many exciting ideas including a pool, a trampoline and an ice cream shack! They made maps in two groups, discussing their ideas and taking turns drawing.

We have cleared the raised beds in our school growing garden to prepare for planting. We are hoping to grow vegetables, fruit and herbs to eat at our end of year party. The class will also be observing how the plants grow, from seeds and bulbs to growing fruit.

In literacy, the children have created villains and heroes for their own 'foodtastic' story inspired by Supertato. On Friday, we planned our stories with a beginning, a middle and an end, ready to begin writing next week. The whole class have been learning about sharing, in Maths, making sure that an amount has been split into equal groups. The children continued to use this in their play. We have also learned how to count and read numbers all the way up to 100!








## Chestnut

This week, Chestnut class have begun a new unit of work in English. We are looking at The Lion and the Mouse, working towards writing a narrative of the story. In the beginning of the week, the children were introduced to the main characters and described them, also making links with other stories they know that have those characters. Later in the week, the children explored the emotions of the two characters throughout the story and sequenced the story. In Maths, we are looking at fractions this week. The children have been finding unit fractions and non-unit fractions of numbers and then exploring the similarity between them.

In Geography on Monday, the children explored human features around Romsey. They used a variety of maps to identify these features, looking for roads, train lines, bridges and buildings. In Computing, the children continued to explore Stop Motion Animation. They developed their skills that they were learning last week when 'onion-skinning'. Chestnut class also recreated a piece of art from Paul Klee, 'Separation in the Evening'. They used their skills of tinting that they were working on last week to choose two colours and gradually blend them together.









## Willow

This week in Willow, we have had an exciting week although we haven't been outside as much as we would like due to the weather turning. In Maths, we have been looking at fractions of amounts and linking this learning to our times tables that we have been focusing on previously. We have been building on what we have learned before to find more than one part of the fraction of a number.

In English, we have been continuing to studying the book 'Meet the Ancient Romans' and looked at some of the most famous Emperors and their characteristics. We decided to elect one of the Emperors to be 'Emperor of the classroom' and the children split into teams to create voting posters, followed by a class election. Trajan was the winner because he was a very wealthy ruler and could help us to be rich too!

In Science, we have started to create a fair test on bones and explored all the different variables we could test – strength, density, and weight, for example – and landed on the question: 'how does bone length effect strength?' Stay posted for the results.





### Oak

This week, Oak class have completed their Mars Rovers. Everyone was successful in using various tools and a range of different ways to join components together. We learned that measuring and marking was an important part of the build process.

We have been on an exciting journey through space using the website https://www.solarsystemscope.com/

This is a fantastic resource to discover fascinating facts about the solar system. Did you know that Titan - one of the moons of Saturn - is the most likely to support life, as it is similar to Earth and is in the 'Goldilocks Zone'?

We also discovered that there are many dwarf planets in our solar system including Eris (and its moon), which are the most distant known natural objects in our system.

This week we have been thinking about sorrow and joy. We thought about the sorrowful story of Moses escaping from Egypt and the joy everyone had when they reached safety.
