News from around school

Beech

Beech class started the week with an exciting new topic in History - Inventors! We shared ideas about what inventors do and what it takes to be a great inventor. We thought about all of the different gifts and talents that we have in our class and how we could use them to invent and create new things ourselves. This sparked Beech class' interest, which



led to the unveiling of the new "Design Den" in our outdoor area. In Maths, we have started to learn about money and have been working with coins up to 10p. The class have been using money to buy items in our new pop-up shop, ensuring they have the right coins.



We have continued to explore the class book 'The Most Magnificent Thing', creating story maps and beginning to use vocabulary such as 'beginning', 'middle' and 'end'. Beech class were also very excited to learn a new word class - verbs! They enjoyed acting out and naming different things that we do each day. We have continued to develop our learning through play in both the indoor and outdoor provisions with new inventions and designs

Chestnut

In our Maths lessons this week, Chestnut class began the week by making arrays of 2, 5 and 10. They were able to draw the arrays to help them understand what the multiplication calculation and repeated addition calculations would be. On Thursday, the children took their knowledge of arrays outside and around the school to see if they could spot any arrays being used in eve-



ryday objects. Some of the objects were: windows (3x4), painted lines on the playground (2x4), the chess board (8x8) and the phonics sounds cards in class (10x3). The children then recorded these and made a display for others to see. We began our new Geography unit of work on Monday: Wonderful West Tytherley. The children had to record everything that they could think of to do with the village; some of their findings were thatched cottages, pub, park, school and the fact that it was a village. Within Art, the children will be exploring Angels. They were given the question of "What is an Angel?" and it was wonderful to see the variety of answers; some mentioning that Angels could be males, have a sword and fight.







Willow

This week in Willow, we have been investigating the key features of a leaflet, looking at things like layout, sub-headings, questions, and grammar. We have been working in groups to discuss and present our findings to the class. This is to support us for when we start writing our own leaflets about nature and wild-life.

In Guided reading, we have been looking at word choices and how they make the author feel. We got to do lots of wall walks - where the information is shown on the wall and we have to walk around to find what we are writing about before we write it down.

Finally, in maths this week, we have been learning about fractions and decimals. This is great, as we get to use lots of resources which we can hold and pick up and move around, and it all helps us visualise what









Oak

This week in Oak class we have started lots of new learning and are at the beginning of learning about some different topics. In geography we will be travelling to Cote D'Ivoire to find out about what they trade in this country and discovering where our foods come from. In R.E., we are exploring different interpretations of the story of the birth of Jesus Christ and discovering whether the Bible story matches our understanding. As scientists, we will be investigating how new materials are created and if a material can be returned to its original state. We had great fun investigating granola and trying to find out the different ingredients it is made from.
