## **News from around school**

#### **Beech**

Beech class started the week learning about Louis Braille and how he invented a way for blind people to read. We retold the story of his life and even had a go at trying to read braille ourselves.

In Maths, we have finished learning about money and how to add coins together and have now moved on to length. The class have been given their own tubs of playdough and have used it to make different size sausages, noting the longest and shortest sausage. We have also been using the playdough to make our recently learnt sounds in phonics, working on our fine motor skills at the same time.

In Literacy, we designed and made our own inventions. We will be writing instructions for them next week. With the choice of three scenarios, the class settled on a robot that could tidy their bedrooms for them.







#### Chestnut

This week in Maths, the children have been looking at division and sharing equally. They worked on calculations that involved their 2, 5 and 10 times table knowledge and put this into practice when solving problems involving division. At the beginning of Maths we now have 10 minutes of mental maths. This takes the form of children answering questions based on their learning so far this year. In Chestnut Class, the children are full of energy when completing these, with music playing in the background, and are becoming more confident with solving the calculations quickly and mentally. In Geography this week, the children have been looking at where we are located in the world. We used the globe to see where we sit on that and then where we are on a map of the world, our country and where we are in the county. We then looked at Google Earth and the children were fascinated to be able to zoom in on West Tytherley and move through the village on Street View. During PE this half term, the children have been learning about Curling. They have practised pushing the stones across the floor and are now beginning to aim at targets.





#### Willow

We have been a whole range of things this week in Willow. Firstly, we have been finishing off fractions and learning to add and subtract fractions. We have been doing lots of group work on boards and using different resources such as cards and special fraction resources.

In English, we have been studying non-chronological reports and looking at the features of books and leaflets, and organising book covers so that we have a really clear idea of what a non-fiction piece of text looks like. We are going to start designing our own leaflet on a wild life animal.

We have been playing 'Simon says' in French, learning all about different classroom instructions. Ask your children if they can remember how to say 'stand up, listen, or be quiet' in French! In science, we have also started looking at electricity. We have discussed and sorted different items found in the house into whether they use batteries, mains electricity, or both. It sparked lots of interesting discussion.







#### Oak

Oak class have been working really hard this week to crack written methods for multiplication. Some children who previously found this very challenging have progressed from counting equal groups of objects, to the compact method of short multiplication.

We have started to get to know a new book, Journy to Jo'Burg by Beverley Naidoo, set in South Africa, during the apartheid era. We are intrigued and shocked at the treatment of Black people in the book.
