News from around school

Beech

What a wonderful cast of performers we have in Beech Class. We stunned our families with our sensational skills on the Bamboo Tamboo at the concert on Tuesday, alongside Chestnut Class. On Wednesday we wowed our audiences with our rendition of the Nativity, telling the story of Jesus' birth and the grumpy donkey who carried Mary to Bethlehem-Poor old grumble!

There has been some superb writing produced this week, inspired by Raymond Briggs' 'The Snowman'. The children have been learning how to use adjectives to describe nouns within their narrative and have been working really hard to perfect their finger spacing and full stops!

The puppet theatre is a new addition to our provision this week and the children have been using it to retell well known fairy tales and improvise new stories of their own. The children made and sold tickets, ice cream, popcorn and drinks whilst using the language and vocabulary that they have developed over this term.







Chestnut

This week the children have showed what incredible performers they are. On Tuesday, Chestnut class, along with Beech class, performed what they had been learning in Music on their Bamboo Tamboo. It was amazing to see how the children were able to keep different rhythms at the same time. Wednesday was the performance of our wonderful Key Stage 1 nativity, 'A Bundle of Joy'. The children, this time, were able to show their acting skills and there are definitely some keen actors in the class. All the hard work the children had put in leading up to it paid off as they remembered their lines, performed their hearts out and sung beautifully.



In class this week, the children have begun to research their own Arctic animal. They had questions that needed answering and we used the laptops to do this one; the children were very excited about using them especially as we brought them down to the class. Next week, the children will write these information texts up and create a class book all about Arctic animals. During our RE session this week, the children learnt about Hannukah. They listened to the story of how it started and then were able to recreate a menorah using paints and their hands. I wonder if your child can tell you how long the menorah in the temple burnt for with only a small amount of oil.







Willow

This week, Willow class students have been visited by a cheeky little elf called Elvis. He has been playing tricks and hiding around the classroom. He has also been watching all the children working hard. We revisited measurements in Maths this week, looking at key facts such as 1/2 of a kilogram. Ask you child if they remember how many grams there are in 1/2 a kilogram.

In English, we have been following the journey of a robin travelling home for Christmas. We have been using prior knowledge to support some of the activities, such as writing the journey of the robin in the style of a fact file. We have also started exploring poetic devices and how authors and poets use them.

Finally, this week, we have been talking about belonging. This concept has been prevalent in a few different subjects. In RE. we made a willow tree, and wrote positive messages about belonging to West Tytherley and Willow class. It has been a very positive week.







Oak

In Oak class this week, we have been thinking about which characters in the Nativity story are the most important. This created much discussion and debate, as they all seemed to have a crucial part to tell. Eventually we decided that with Jesus at the centre of the story, all others had equal importance: Mary, as she was his mother, Joseph, as he was the descendant of King David, which meant the family had to travel to Bethlehem (which fulfilled a prophecy), the Angel who brought messages to several different people, the shepherds who were the first visitors and took the Good News of the birth into the street, and the star-watchers who brought gifts to signify the birth of a king. This term's learning in RE has made us think about the story of Christmas in lots of new ways.

In science, the children have been learning about how substances can be separated, using sieving or evaporation, for example, and finding out about how new substances are created through melting, dissolving or heating.

Oak class will be visiting Twinkle-Toes on Friday morning and are really looking forward to creating some Christmas crafts with the children there.
