Thought for the Week

In the Church, this coming Sunday is called Pentecost. It is 50 days after Easter and is known as the Church's Birthday. Some churches even celebrate with Birthday Cakes after their Sunday Services! Sports Day

On Wednesday 24th May the sun shone for our sports day. The day was split into two parts, with a picnic in the middle. The morning consisted of a round robin of events, lasting 25 minutes before changing station. The children completed 5 activities and were praised for showing our learning behaviours – have a go hero, in the driving seat, spreading sunshine, as well as thinking outside of the box. The different activities were:

 \cdot Quick feet – children stepped in to a column of squares, up and back, across the chess board. They had to see how many times they could do this within 1 minute.

 \cdot Target throw – the children were given 3 balls to aim at a large target. They counted up their score and then on subsequent goes, they would try and better that score.

 \cdot Seated volleyball – the children were split into two smaller teams within their groups. There were different versions of this game that were played – try to beat the opposition and get the ball to hit the floor and how long could they keep the rally going.

• Chip the river – here, the children had to chip a ball over the 'river' (a set of blue cones) but not too hard that it went into or over the 'sand bunker' (the white cones). They were aiming for the green cones in the middle, using control and gentle power.

• Obstacle course – a track with a roundabout at the end was laid out and the children travelled along the route on space hoppers. This station had a huge amount of laughter and encouragement coming from it as some children found this task much harder than they originally thought and fell off quite a bit.

After the morning's events, we gathered on the field, those who were having packed lunch, to have our picnics, along with some of the parents, before then heading off to Broughton Playing Field.

The afternoon consisted of the running races part of the day. There was a sprint race, a longer race and a relay. Throughout the different races, it was wonderful to see the encouragement from all the children, through the cheering that was happening.

Well done to all those children who participated in any part of the sports day. You demonstrated our values and you challenged yourself in the activities, whether that was here or at the running races.
