## **News from around school**

### **Beech**

This week Beech Class have been interviewing Mrs Rose and Mrs Bowyer about what the school was like in the past, learning that all of the upstairs was built much later than the front of the school! We adventured around the school grounds, armed with clipboards and pencils, making note of any significant dates and plaques that we could see. The children noticed the difference in the brick work and the tiles from KS1 to KS2. They asked the adults to help them read the dates and discovered that even though they seemed new to the grown-ups, the children thought it was all old as it was built before they were born!

In maths, we have finished our learning on money for the year, but will continue to use it during our play in the class shop. We have started to revisit weight and the children have made their own scales from hangers and cups. We have even used our bodies as weights on a see saw that Hugo and Edward made!

The children explored the bee investigation table in the centre of the classroom which had a mysterious substance in a jar- honey! The children were amazed by the comb and could not believe that it was made by such a small insect. Whilst looking at our new vegetable patch, the reception children saw a bumble bee on one of our strawberry plants, looking for nectar.







#### Chestnut

On Wednesday morning, the children joined Broughton's Otter class to participate in a virtual visit with someone from the Sea City Museum in Southampton. They discussed what life was like on the Titanic and used photographs to discuss which part of the ship they might have been in. The children also compared cabins from the First and Third Class and looked at the gym that the First Class passengers had use of (they even had an electric race horse, as you clearly couldn't go longer than a week without riding your horse, f you were travelling in first class). The children shared the knowledge they have already started developing; Barney was able to explain that one of the chimneys was fake, not just for storing deck chairs but because it looked better with four and not three.

In Maths this week, the children have been looking at multiplication and division and using arrays to work out calculations. They have then used this knowledge to solve problems around these concepts. In English, the children have continued to think about the characters in Pesky Plastic and have been asking questions that may prompt an apology. They have also been matching up sentences and using conjunctions to extend them.

During Music on Tuesday, the children were introduced to the instrument for this half term – a xylophone. They were tasked with creating a doorbell. Some of the doorbells were sounding very musical; I wouldn't mind having some of them as mine.







#### Willow


This week in Willow we have been doing some really interesting activities. We had a special visitor to teach us some African dance and we are working towards making a video for the common wealth games. We practised our steps and showed the dance teacher what we could do. She was very impressed.

We have also been watering our seeds which we planted last week and already are starting to see some growth, even the pot that was put inside a cupboard. I have also included some pictures of the art we did on Friday afternoon last week because it is so beautiful. We experimented with colour and made gradients using two of the three primary colours.

In English we have been doing lots of work on description. Looking at different ways to level-up our sentences as to make them as interesting and effective as possible. We took pictures from the book, described them with expanded noun phrases, then we put them into clauses and joined those clauses with conjunctions to make some really complex and descriptive sentences. In maths we have been working on missing number problems and word problems for multiplication and division. The children have been working really hard to make their work as neat as possible, which makes me so happy. Well done this week Willow class.













#### Oak

This week the children have continued to enjoy the guided reading text Beetle Boy. We have looked at sums of inference, the technique of putting two lots of evidence, taken directly from the text and using them to draw conclusions about settings and characters.

In English we have created metaphors linked to verbs and created our class poem, based on the form of one that we have studied. I was most impressed with the children's ability to manipulate language so effectively.

Maths has been some whistle- stop work on angles and interpreting data.

In Geography we have familiarised ourselves with the United Kingdom and the capital cities, we have used compass directions to plan a trip and also looked at what types of information are represented on maps.

We hope to visit the bluebells next Friday- this will help with our poetry writing. I will be in touch with details.
