

Our improvement priorities this year

We are very proud of our school and all that it offers.

But we are always striving to improve the education we provide for all the children in our care.

There are many areas where we have aims and plans that support the children's personal and academic development.

Each year, we capture a small number of key priorities in a school improvement plan. Here are our current four key priorities, which we will focus on, monitor, and adapt as the year progresses.

Priority 1: Reading and phonics	Aim: To develop fluent readers through a well-planned and interconnected phonics and guided reading curriculum including effective monitoring which identifies and leads to appropriate additional support being implemented for readers across the learning range.
Priority 2: Outdoor education provision	Aim: To develop a forest schools program in EYFS and KS1 which fosters resilience, strong learning behaviours and community cohesion whilst promoting a love of outdoors and understanding of our local area.
Priority 3: High quality teaching and learning	Aim: To develop the quality of teaching and learning in Maths to ensure improved outcomes for all (including those children with additional learning, physical or behavioural needs and higher attainers) through effective Assessment for Learning which uses best practice to scaffold and stretch children and allows staff to teach responsively.
Priority 4: School Culture	Aim: To continue to build a positive and outward looking school culture which prepares children as engaged global and local citizens with understanding of Christian values.
